	Personal Pronouns <i>Can take the place of a noun</i>				Reflexive
	Subjective Pronouns <i>Also known as nominative or subjective.</i>	Objective Pronouns <i>Can be used as direct objects, object of the preposition, indirect objects.</i>	Possessive Adjectives <i>Modifiers: Pronouns used as adjectives that show possession.</i>	Possessive Pronouns <i>Independent: Used as predicate adjectives with linking verbs or direct object with transitive verbs.</i>	Reflexive Pronouns <i>Can be used as direct objects, object of the preposition, indirect objects and sometimes as predicate nouns.</i>
1st person singular	I	me	my	mine	myself
2nd person singular	you	you	your	yours	yourself
3rd person singular <i>masculine</i>	he	him	his	his	himself
